Doris Christopher announced Thursday that Griffin Rotary is launching an innovative educational project aimed at decreasing the high school dropout rate in Griffin-Spalding schools. Christopher asked for everyone's assistance in this ambitious project which is slated to begin this school year. The initial step will be an art and design competition in which ninth graders will be charged with creating and designing their 2018 graduating class pen. The best-of-the-best designs will be recognized. And, those competing will be asked to sign a commitment to remain in school and graduate in 2018 with the pen designed in their first year in high school. Students also will be given discount cards to use at places of business in the community showing community support of their commitment. "We become graduation coaches," Christopher said. "By reducing our dropout rate, we improve the quality of life for all in our community."
